| can you confirm that rhodecode index module does not support elasticsearch > 2.x ? I was expecting to bump to a stable version of elasticsearch (6.x) soon but this seems to be incompatible with the version of python-elasticsearch you are including in rhodecode. Could that be at least documented because I looked at the doc and nothing seems to exist about elasticsearch version requirement ! I tried with 4.11.6 and 4.12.2 but this is more related to the python module used to this purpose. | | | |
